# ORIENTATION CLASSES

## General

Orientation is available for Adults, Young Adults (18 – 25) and Youth (13 – 17). Kids (12 and Under) are encouraged to attend Child Evangelism. If the Young People (under the age of 12) attend an Orientation Class with their Parent(s)/Guardian(s), they meet the necessary Orientation Requirement for their respective age group. Know that Child Evangelism is not Orientation.

## Topics

### **PART I: SALVATION AND ASSURANCE**

Course Description: This class will take a look at the Scriptural concepts of salvation and it's assurance for the believer.

Course Goals: By the completion of this segment, each student will know the fundamental truths of:

- The definition of Biblical Salvation
- The Perfect Plan of Salvation
- The Perfect Work of Salvation
- The Unbreakable Promise of Salvation

### **PART II: FOUNDATION OF SPIRITUAL GROWTH**

Course Description: This class will look at personal devotion for the individual thru prayer, bible study and fellowship.

Course Goals: By completion of this segment, each student will know:

- Why Spiritual Growth is important to a Believer
- Hindrances of our growth
- Aspects that affect growth
- Why we need fellowship.
- Benefits of Personal Devotion and the study of GOD'S Word



### **PART III: INTRO TO DISCIPLESHIP**

Course Description: This class will give direction concerning the teachings (doctrine) pertaining to GOD and provide instruction for living for HIM.

Course Goals: Christian Growth/Maturity – By the completion of this segment, each student will have received:

- A definition of Discipleship
- Explanation of what it means to be chosen and called by JESUS to be a Disciple
- Six disciplines for New and Growing Believers

### **PART IV: STEWARDSHIP**

Course Description: This class will take a look at the Scriptural concepts surrounding the living and giving of Christians.

Course Goals: By the completion of this segment, each student will have received:

- A definition of Stewardship
- A Biblical look at witnessing (Evangelism) and Kingdom service through a personal relationship with JESUS the CHRIST
- A basic understanding of a servant's lifestyle
- An introduction to the F.A.I.T.H. Ministry
- The concept of giving (Tithes & Offerings) from the Biblical perspective
- An understanding of a budget done GOD's way

### **PART V: NEW HORIZON (MEMBER EXPECTATIONS)**

Course Description: This class will touch on the history of St. James Missionary Baptist Church and will introduce four biblical expectations of Church Members.

Course Goals: By the completion of this segment, each student will have received:

- A theological commentary on expectations of St. James Members
- An emphasis on the Core Values of St. James
- References to the Church Covenant, Mission and Vision of St. James
- References to the history of St. James

# ORIENTATION OPTIONS

## Orientation Encouragement

Know that Orientation is for you, but it does not hinder you from participating or serving. You have the rights and privileges of being a member of St. James by you following GOD's lead to join the St. James Family. Even though the NCM Facilitators would love to see you complete your orientation, you don't have to wait to start your Kingdom work.

## Orientation Opportunities

- 1) Online Orientation => Lessons and Quizzes are located on the St. James Website.
- 2) Regular Orientation => Orientation Classes are taught at 9:00AM on the second floor, in the Trinity Room. These classes are part of Church School and are approximately 40 – 45 minutes in length. The topics are on a rotation.
- 3) Mini-Orientation => Orientation Classes are taught after the Sunday Morning Worship Service in Room 153. These are abbreviated classes, approximately 10 – 15 minutes in length. The class topic varies depending on the needs of the attendees.
- 4) Quarterly Orientation => For those who cannot take the Online Orientation and cannot make the in-person Orientation Classes taught on Sundays or even someone is looking for Make-Up Classes, the NCM Staff will offer Special Orientation Classes on the Saturdays leading up to 5th Sundays. These Quarterly Classes will be 20 – 25 minutes in length. These classes are upon request and can include an abbreviated tour of the St. James Campus.

## Orientation Credit

Adults seeking a Certificate of Completion must take 5 of the offered Orientation Classes. Youth and Young Adults must take 4 of the offered Orientation Classes to receive their certificate. Upon completion of the aforementioned classes, the NCM Certification Team will ensure that you receive your Certificate of Completion.

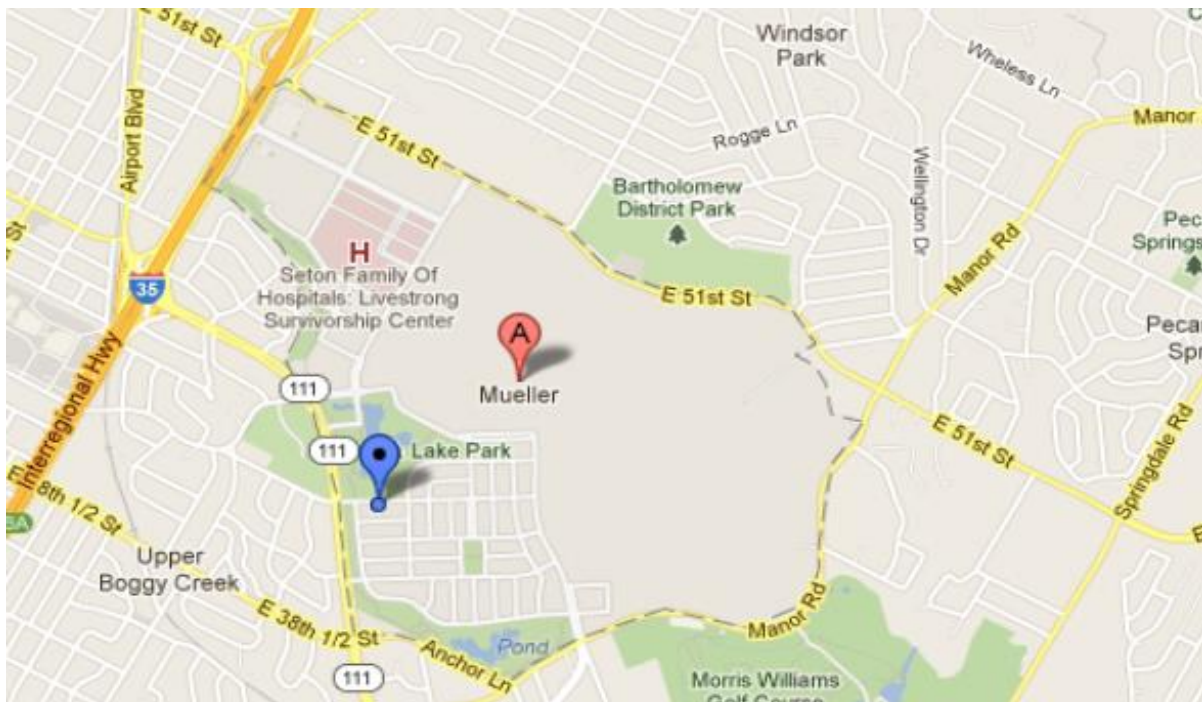
# MISSION FIELD
